Annual Report on Approved and Terminated Programs, FY 2008- 2009 **(For Information Only)**

Background

This report contains information on the number of new programs approved, existing programs modified, and existing programs terminated by the Commission during FY 2008-2009. The term “program” as used here also includes concentrations, centers, options, and programs deleted from specific sites. Nineteen new programs were added, twelve were modified, and twenty-nine were terminated during this year.

The listing of programs approved and modified is found in **Attachments 1 and 2**. The listing of terminations is found in **Attachment 3**. The terminations are presented by institution. This information is presented to members of the Committee for information only to provide an overview of program approval activity during the past year.

Approval of New Programs, 2008-2009

Program development occurred at all levels this year. There were five programs developed at the associate’s degree level and seven at the baccalaureate level. There were four new master’s degree programs developed and two doctoral programs. There was one institute developed during this year.

Of the 19 **new** programs approved in FY 2008-2009, eleven general areas of curricular growth can be identified:

Modifications of Programs, 2008-2009

There were twelve programs modified, five at the baccalaureate level and seven at the master’s degree level. The Citadel modified the most programs by adding teacher education concentrations to some of its programs. Clemson and Winthrop each had three modifications. Clemson modified two of its education programs and its Master of Public Administration program. Winthrop modified three of its programs by adding new site locations. S.C. State modified one program by adding a new site location at Aiken Technical College. The College of Charleston modified one program in mathematics. The complete list of modifications can be found in **Attachment 2**.

Terminations of Programs, 2008-2009

Twelve institutions had termination activity during the 2008-2009 year. Clemson terminated four centers, one full program in commerce, and two site locations in North Carolina for the Master of Education in Counselor Education program. The Medical University of South Carolina terminated two on-line tracks in the Doctor of Physical Therapy and the Physician’s Assistant Studies program as well as a master’s degree program in Cytology and Biosciences. Lander terminated its teacher education concentration in its undergraduate Spanish program. College of Charleston terminated four education programs at the master’s degree level and then combined the four programs into one master’s degree with specific specializations.

There were 15 programs and concentrations terminated within the Technical College System. Both Aiken Technical College and Central Carolina Technical College

terminated a program in engineering technology. Greenville Technical College terminated a program in electronics technology. Midlands Technical College terminated a program in court reporting. Spartanburg Community College terminated its concentration in hotel, restaurant, and travel in the Associate in Business Management degree. Technical College of the Lowcountry terminated its building construction technology program. Horry-Georgetown Technical College terminated three programs, including an off-site location of the hospitality tourism management program and programs in electronics technology and vocational technical education. Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College terminated five programs: forest products technology, vocational technical education, electronic instrumentation technology, engineering graphics technology, and emergency medical technology.

Of the 29 existing programs and concentrations (including site locations) **terminated** in FY 2008-09, ten general curricular areas can be identified across all institutions:

Comparison of Newly Approved Programs with Terminated Programs

In the past year, the total of new program terminations exceeded program approvals by ten. The majority of the terminations were at the associate degree level. There were no baccalaureate or doctoral programs terminated during FY 2008-09.

Table 3 compares the number of new programs approved with the number of programs terminated.
