#### **2002-03 Palmetto Fellows Scholarship**

The Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Program is a merit-based scholarship program designed to recognize the most academically talented high school seniors in S.C. and encourage them to attend college in the State. During the 2002-03 academic year, each Palmetto Fellow could receive a scholarship of up to \$6,700 per year for a maximum of eight terms. The scholarship must be applied towards the cost-of-attendance to pursue the first baccalaureate degree at a participating senior institution in the State.

In order to be eligible to apply for a Palmetto Fellows Scholarship, a student must meet the following minimum academic requirements: (1) score at least 1200 on the SAT or 27 on the ACT; (2) earn a 3.5 cumulative GPA on the Uniform Grading Scale through the end of the junior year; and (3) rank in the top five percent of the class at the end of either the sophomore or the junior year. For the 2003 cohort of first-time entering freshmen, the Commission on Higher Education received 1377 applications. 1133 new scholarships were awarded to students with an average SAT score of 1300 (ACT scores were converted to SAT).

For the 2002-03 academic year, \$19.1 million was disbursed to 2985 Palmetto Fellows as of August 31, 2003. This is an 11% increase in the number of students awarded compared with 2001-02. The following pages provide detailed reports to include: number of Palmetto Fellows awarded and amount disbursed per institution; recipients by ethnic group; recipients by gender; recipients by student level; retention statistics; 2002-03 Palmetto Fellows by county of origin; and, 2003 first-time entering Palmetto Fellows by county of origin. 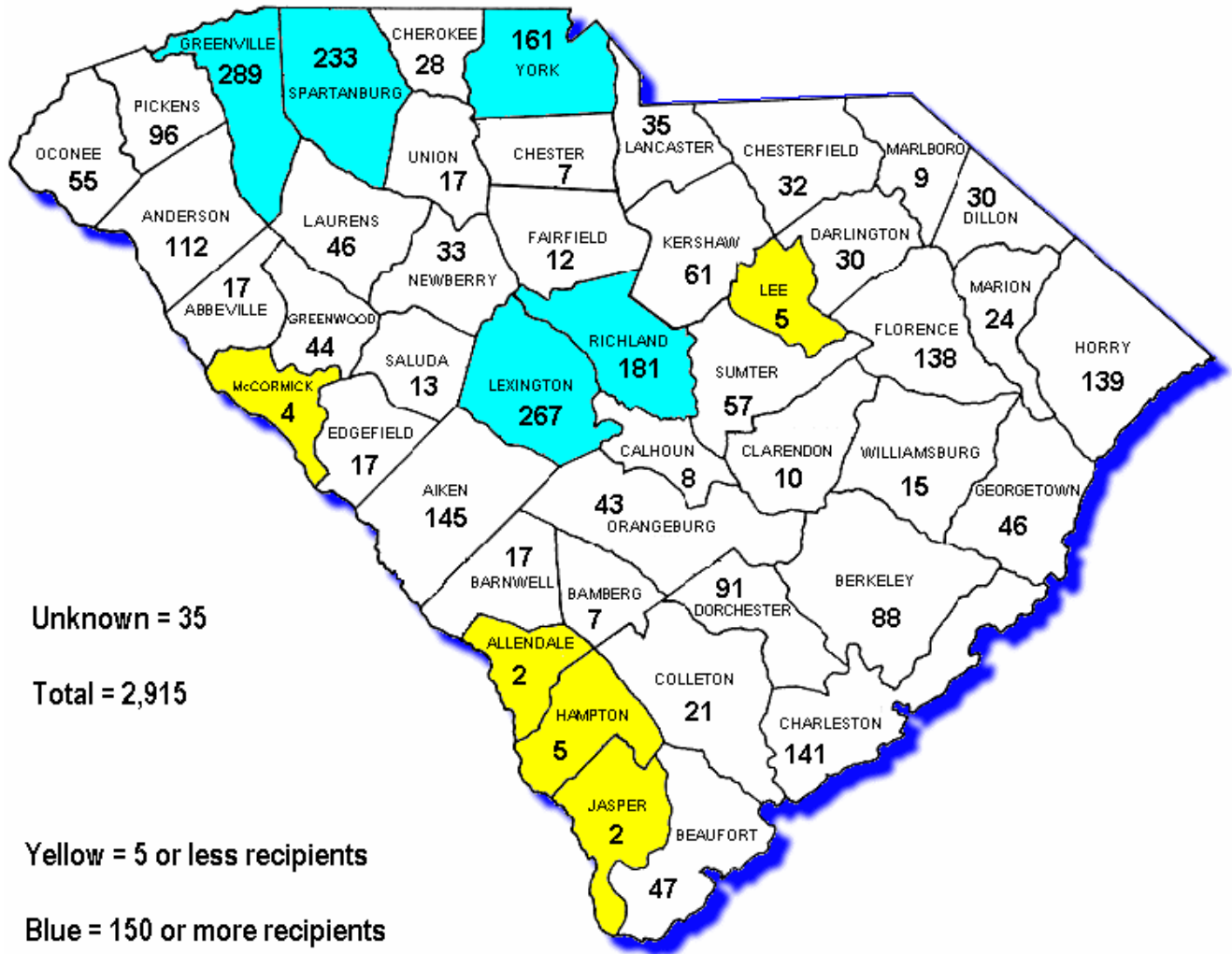
