Report on Terminated and Approved Academic Degree Programs, Program Components, and Centers/Institutes, July 2011 – June 2012 (For Information Only)

Background

This report contains information on the number of existing academic degree programs terminated, approved, and modified by the Commission from July 2011 – June 2012. It also describes program component changes, including changes to concentrations, options, and tracks; programs extended to or terminated from specific sites; and new and terminated pre- and post-baccalaureate and graduate certificates. The report also lists newly created and terminated centers and institutes. During the period July 2011 – June 2012, 14 academic degree programs, 26 program concentrations, and three certificate programs were terminated while six programs were terminated from specific sites. Also during this period, 14 new academic degree programs were approved and the institutions added 22 program concentrations; offered eight new certificate programs; extended 23 programs to new sites; and created four centers or institutes. In addition, six degree programs were modified. The listing of academic degree programs, program components, and centers/institutes terminated and approved is found in Attachment 1. This information is presented to members of the Committee for information only to provide an overview of program approval activity from July 2011 – June 2012.

Terminations of Academic Degree Programs and Program Components

From July 2011 – June 2012, eight institutions terminated programs or program components:

- Horry-Georgetown Technical College terminated three academic degree programs: the Associate in Applied Science in Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning; Associate in Applied Science in Hospitality and Tourism Management; and Associate in Applied Science in Occupational Therapy Assistant. The institution also terminated six programs at specific sites as these programs were moved to new sites: the Associate in Applied Science in Criminal Justice Technology moved from the Grand Strand campus to the Main campus; the Associate in Applied Science in Dental Hygiene, Associate in Applied Science in Human Services, Associate in Applied Science in Pharmacy Technology, and Associate in Applied Science in Radiologic Technology programs moved from the main campus to the Grand Strand campus; and the Associate in Applied Science in Nursing moved from the main campus to the Grand Strand and Georgetown campuses.
- Technical College of the Lowcountry terminated the program leading to the Applied Science in Emergency Medical Technology.
- Clemson University terminated the program leading to the Master of Education in Early Childhood Education and the undergraduate certificate program in Substance Abuse.
- The College of Charleston terminated 13 program concentrations: the Financial Reporting/Auditing, Tax, and Generalist concentrations from the Master of Science in Accountancy program; the Environmental Risk Assessment, Environmental Policy, and Environmental Science concentrations from the Master of Science in Environmental Studies; the French and Latin concentrations from the Master of Education in Languages program; the Emotionally Handicapped, Mentally Handicapped, and Learning Disabled concentrations from the Master of Arts in Teaching in Special Education program; and the Teaching Children and Youth in the Contemporary Context and Teacher as Change Agent concentrations from the Master of Education in Teaching, Learning, and Advocacy program.
- Lander University terminated the program leading to the Master of Education in Elementary Education.
- The Medical University of South Carolina terminated two graduate certificates in Nursing: Psychiatric Nursing and Mental Health Advance Practice.
- The University of South Carolina – Columbia terminated seven academic degree programs: the Bachelor of Science in Business and Technology Education; Bachelor of Science in Business Education; Master of Arts in Teaching in Business Education; Master of Music in Music Theory; Master of Public Administration (joint program with the College of Charleston); the Doctor of Education in Health Education Administration; and the Doctor of Philosophy in International Studies. The University also terminated 11 program concentrations: the Intermedia Studies concentration from the Bachelor of Fine Arts in Art Studio program; the Athletic Training concentration from the Bachelor of Science in Physical Education program; the Early Childhood Education, Elementary Education, and Secondary Education concentrations from the Doctor of Education in Curriculum and Instruction; the Behavioral Neuroscience, Cognitive Neuroscience, Cognitive Psychology, and Developmental Psychology concentrations from the Doctor of

Philosophy in Experimental Psychology; and the Ancient World and Medieval World concentrations from the Doctor of Philosophy in History.

- Winthrop University terminated the program leading to the Master of Science in Software Development and the Business/Marketing and Family and Consumer Science concentrations from the Master of Arts in Secondary Teacher Education program.

The programs and program components terminated encompass several different fields as shown in Table 1. Table 2 shows the eight institutions that terminated programs or program components.

Approval of Academic Degree Programs, Program Components, and Centers/Institutes

From July 2011 – June 2012, 14 institutions added academic degree programs, program components, or centers/institutes:

- Florence-Darlington Technical College added the program leading to the Applied Science in Mechanical Engineering Technology.
- Horry-Georgetown Technical College extended nine degree programs to new sites, six of which were terminated from one site to be moved to the new sites. The Associate in Applied Science in Culinary Arts and the Associate in Applied Science in Early Care and Education programs were extended to the Grand Strand campus and the Associate in Applied Science in General Technology was extended to the Grand Strand and Georgetown campuses. The Associate in Applied Science in Criminal Justice Technology moved from the Grand Strand campus to the Main campus; the Associate in Applied Science in Dental Hygiene, Associate in Applied Science in Human Services, Associate in Applied Science in Pharmacy Technology, and Associate in Applied Science in Radiologic Technology programs moved from the main campus to the Grand Strand campus; and the Associate in Applied Science in Nursing moved from the main campus to the Grand Strand and Georgetown campuses.
- Spartanburg Community College added three program concentrations: the A+ Certification and Networking concentrations to the Associate in Applied Science in Electronics Engineering Technology program and the Human Resources concentration to the Associate in Applied Science in Management program.

- York Technical College extended eight degree programs to the Chester Center site: the Associate of Arts in General Liberal Arts and Sciences; Associate of Science in General Liberal Arts and Sciences; Associate in Applied Science in Accounting Technology; Associate in Applied Science in Administrative Office Technology; Associate in Applied Science in Criminal Justice Technology; Associate in Applied Science in General Business; Associate in Applied Science in Industrial Maintenance Technology; and Associate in Applied Science in Management.
- The Citadel added the program leading to the Bachelor of Science in Sport Management.
- Clemson University added the program leading to the Master of Engineering in Systems Engineering and added the concentration in Entrepreneurship and Innovation to the Master of Business Administration program. The institution also extended two programs to new sites: the Bachelor of Science in Parks Recreation and Tourism Management with the concentration in Therapeutic Recreation to the University Center of Greenville site and the Master of Business Administration to Santiago, Chile. The institution added four certificate programs: the pre-baccalaureate certificate program in Public Health; undergraduate certificate program in Six Sigma; graduate certificate program in English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL); and graduate certificate program in Medical Device Design, Recycling, and Reprocessing. In addition, Clemson created the Workforce Development Center and two new institutes: the Human Factors and Ergonomics Institute and the Institute for Sustainability.
- Coastal Carolina University added the program leading to the Bachelor of Arts in Intelligence and National Security Issues; added four program concentrations to the Bachelor of Arts in Communications program: Communication Studies, Health Communication, Interactive Journalism, and Public Relations/Integrated Communication; and added graduate certificate programs in Fraud Examination and in Applied Computing and Information Systems.
- The College of Charleston added three academic programs: the Bachelor of Arts/Artium Baccalaureatus in Dance, Bachelor of Arts/Artium Baccalaureatus in Exercise Science, and Bachelor of Arts/Artium Baccalaureatus and Bachelor of Science/Artium Baccalaureatus in Public Health. The institution also added seven program concentrations: the Finance concentration to the Bachelor of Science/Artium Baccalaureatus in Business Administration program; Politics, Philosophy, and Law concentration to the Bachelor of Arts/Artium Baccalaureatus in Political Science program; and Performance, Costume Design and Technology, Scenic/Lighting and Technology, Theatre for Youth, and General Theatre concentrations to the Bachelor of Arts/Artium Baccalaureatus in Theatre program
- Francis Marion University added the program leading to the Master of Science in Nursing, Family Nurse Practitioner.
- Lander University added the program leading to the Master of Education in Teaching and Learning with concentrations in Diverse Learners, Exercise and Sports Studies, and Instructional Technology. This program replaced the terminated Master of Education in Elementary Education program.

- The University of South Carolina – Beaufort added the program leading to the Bachelor of Arts in Communication Studies and added the Coastal Ecology and Conservation concentration to the Bachelor Science in Biology program
- The University of South Carolina – Columbia added four academic degree programs: the Accelerated Master of Business Administration (A.M.B.A.); Master of Health Information Technology (M.H.I.T.); Master of Science in Engineering Management; and Master of Science/Master of Engineering in Aerospace Engineering. The institution also extended the Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) by blended delivery to sites in Columbia, Charleston, and Greenville; added a graduate certificate program in Play Therapy; and created the Institute for Advancement of Health Care.
- The University of South Carolina – Upstate added the Nonprofit Administration concentration to the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration program and extended three programs by offering them online: the Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice; Bachelor of Arts in Information Management and Systems; and Bachelor of Arts in Engineering Technology Management.
- Winthrop University added five program concentrations: the Sustainable Business concentration to the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration program; the Human Resource Management, Marketing, and Strategic Leadership concentrations to the Master of Business Administration program; and the Political and Civic Engagement concentration to the Master of Liberal Arts program.

Overall, at the associate's degree level, one technical college added one academic degree program, one technical college added three concentrations, and two technical colleges extended a total of 17 programs to new sites. At the bachelor's degree level, the institutions added six new academic degree programs and fourteen program concentrations; extended four programs to new sites; and added one undergraduate certificate program. At the master's degree level, the institutions developed seven academic degree programs, added five program concentrations, and extended one program to a new site. At the doctoral level, one program was extended to new sites. In addition, one pre-baccalaureate and six graduate certificate programs were developed and three Institutes and one Center were created during this time.

The programs, program components, and centers/institutes added encompass many different fields as shown in Table 3. Table 4 shows the institutions that added programs, program components, or centers/institutes.

Modifications of Academic Degree Programs

Six degree programs were modified during this period, including four at the baccalaureate level and two at the master's level. Clemson University modified the existing program leading to the Bachelors of Arts degree in Science Education by adding a Physics concentration to meet an existing need for more teachers of physics in South Carolina. The College of Charleston modified the existing Master of Public Administration program offered jointly with the University of South Carolina –Columbia to offer it as a stand-alone program. The University of South Carolina – Upstate modified the Bachelor of Science in Physical Education by replacing the concentration in Corporate Fitness with the concentration in Exercise and Sport Science to bring the curriculum into conformity with national standards for the field. Winthrop University modified the Bachelor of Arts in Mass Communications by eliminating the concentrations in Journalism and Broadcasting in order to offer a single option degree program in response to changes in the industry. Winthrop University also modified two programs by adding concentrations: the institution added Chemistry to the program leading to the Master of Arts in Teaching program and added Musical Theatre to the Bachelor of Arts in Theatre program.

Comparison of Terminated and Approved Academic Degree Programs, Program Components, and Centers/Institutes

Tables 5 and 6 compare the number of academic degree programs, program components, and centers/institutes terminated with the number of those approved by category and by type of institution, respectively.

As shown in the tables above, the institutions added 22 more academic degree programs, program components, and centers/institutes than the number of those terminated. However, it is worth noting that this net gain is due to the number of programs extended to new sites, certificate programs developed, and centers/institutes created because the institutions showed a net gain of zero academic degree programs and a net loss of four program concentrations. In addition, the technical colleges and comprehensive teaching institutions had a net gain in academic degree programs, program components, and centers/institutes while the research institutions had a net loss of four. Table 7 compares the number of academic degree programs, program components, and centers/institutes terminated with the number of those approved by institution.

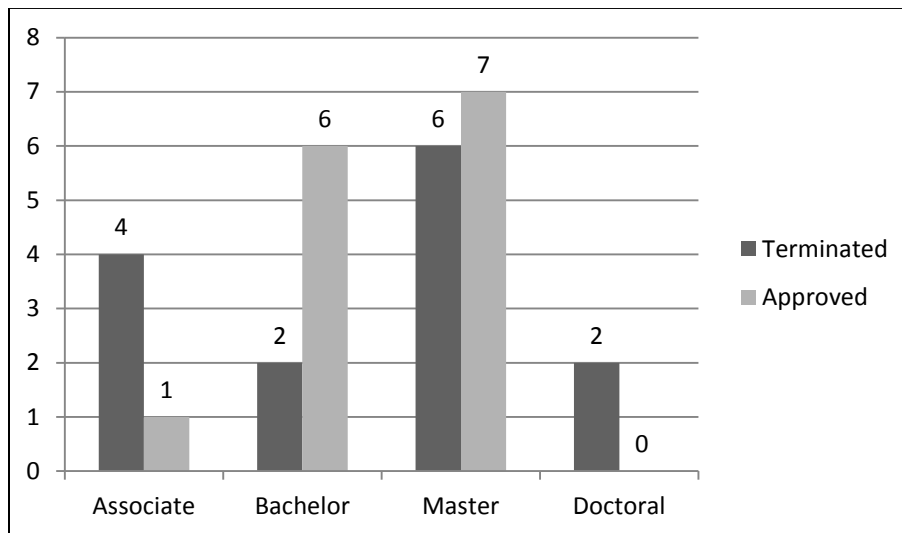

Figure 1. Terminated and Approved Academic Degree Programs by Degree Level, July 2011 – June 2012

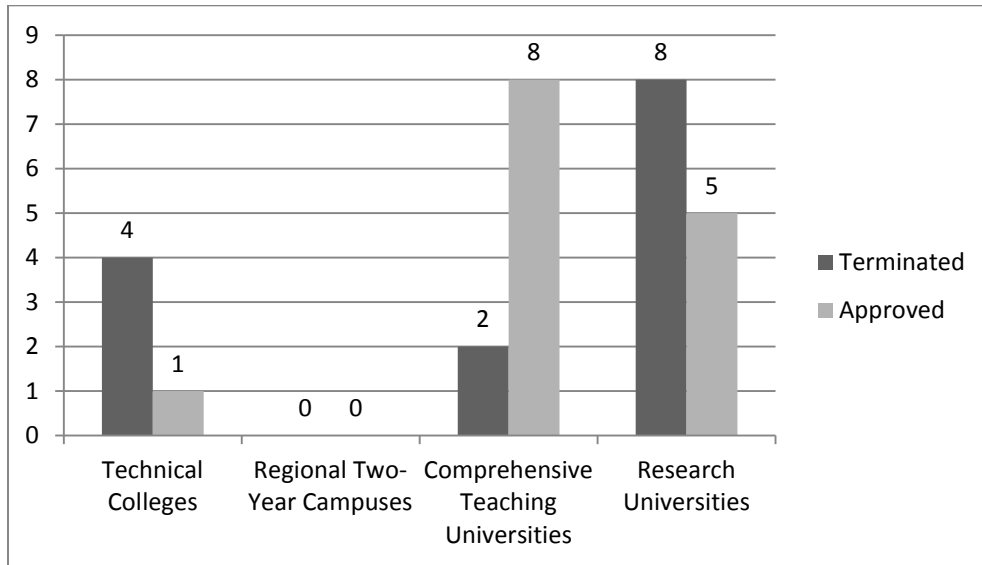


As shown above, the majority of the academic degree program terminations occurred at the master's degree level.

Overall, the institutions had a net gain of zero academic degree programs with the research universities producing the most academic degree program terminations and the comprehensive teaching universities receiving the majority of the new academic degree program approvals.
