

## In-State for Fee Purposes Classification

In-State and Out-of-State enrollment are calculated using data reported by legal residency classification for fee purposes (*SC Code of Laws 59-112-10, et seq, ,and Reg. 62.600, et seq*) where:

**In-State enrollment** is defined here as those SC residents for fee purposes including limited statutory exceptions for certain persons and their dependents residing or working in SC or for which SC has statutory reciprocal arrangements enabling SC students to attend institutions outside of SC at in-state rates. **Out-of-State** includes nonresidents of South Carolina and those nonresident exception students on scholarship (non-state) who may have a full or partial waiver of the out-of-state tuition differential per board approved policy as allowed by Section 59-112-70 of the SC Code of Laws, as amended. See below each table for additional details concerning in-state and out-of-state categories.

**In-State** includes the following "In-State" categories for Fee Purposes:

1) Resident of S.C. (public and independent institutions)

A) military personnel and their dependents in SC; (public only)

B) faculty/staff employed by State institutions and their dependents; (public only)

C) retirees and their dependents who reside in SC and have been domiciled in SC for less than one year and maintain a residence in SC; (public only)

D) full-time employees in SC and their dependents who have taken steps to establish residency; (public only)

E) students participating in the reciprocal Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) Academic Common Market program whereby students may take programs not available in their state but offered in another state within the region at the in-state rate; (public only)

G) reciprocity agreements which enable reciprocity with other states with regard to in-state tuition and fees; (public only) and

H) non-resident aliens in approved VISA classifications once they have been awarded permanent resident status and meet statutory provisions for residency and domiciliary. (public only)

I) Covered individuals receiving veterans GI Bill Chapter 30 and 33 education benefits (Section 59-112-50C) (public only)

**Out-of-State** includes the following categories for Fee Purposes:

2) Non-Resident of SC; (Public and Independent Institutions) and

F) Non-resident exception for fee category including out-of-state students on non-state scholarships for which the board may adopt a policy to provide for a waiver of the tuition differential. (public only)
