

Legislative Updates of interest for Higher Education Week of May 5 – May 9, 2008

Budget Update –

By Thursday, the House had amended the budget bills ([H.4800 and H.4801](#)) returned them to the Senate. As a reminder in regard to the process, the House now has an opportunity to concur with the Senate recommendations or amend the recommendations prior to returning the budget to the Senate. If the House recommendations differ from those of the Senate, a conference committee will be named. Three members from each chamber including the respective finance committee chairs will be appointed to serve on the budget conference committee which will work out the differences between the two versions of the budget. Once the conference committee has done so and the General Assembly has agreed to the budget, it goes to the Governor who will have the opportunity to veto items. The General Assembly will consider any vetoes before the budget is finalized.

In the House –

On Tuesday, a subcommittee of Ways and Means met and considered several Senate bills including: [S.1140](#) relating to requirements of state agencies and energy conservation plans, [S.75](#) relating to the closing of the state's tuition prepayment plan, and [S.1252](#) relating to the Research Centers of Economic Excellence. The subcommittee voted to table S.1140 which will keep the bill in subcommittee; to amend S.75 in keeping with a budget proviso (60.13) to close the tuition prepayment program to new enrollees that had been enacted for FY 2007-08; and to amend S.1252 by striking the Senate language and inserting the language in [H.4494](#) relating to this program and had passed the House earlier in the session. [S.1022](#) relating to the Critical Needs Nursing Initiative received a favorable report in subcommittee during the week and will next be considered by the full Medical, Military and Public and Municipal Affairs Committee. The Higher Education Subcommittee of House Education and Public Works met on Wednesday. The subcommittee voted to report favorably to the full committee [S.991](#) which makes a technical correction to a code citation that had been inadvertently included in the chapter relating to CHE and voted to adjourn debate on [S.1207](#) relating to the composition of the SC State Board of Trustees and [S.1233](#) relating to the waiver of the out-of-state tuition differential for those establishing residency in South Carolina but working full-time in adjoining NC or GA counties and CHE regulations relating to SC HOPE Scholarships ([Document #3173](#)), Need-based Grants ([Document #3185](#)), Residency for Tuition and Fee Purposes ([Document #3172](#)) and the National Guard College Assistance Program ([Document # 3196](#)). It is noted that the subcommittee's action does not affect the 120 day review period of the General Assembly.

Also during the week, the House amended [S.950](#) relating to Denmark Technical College and authority to enter into ground lease agreements with private entities, gave the bill its third reading and returned the bill to the Senate.

In the Senate –

[S.530](#) that would codify in permanent legislation a number of temporary provisions that have been included in the annual Appropriations Acts and [S.1115](#) relating to a residency exception for tuition and fee purposes for certain military and dependents received third reading on Wednesday. These bills were sent to the House where they were introduced and referred to the House Ways and Means Committee. [H.4408](#) relating to the course eligibility requirements for science and math enhancements for LIFE and Palmetto Fellows received its third reading in the Senate on Thursday and was enrolled for ratification. Once H.4408 is ratified, it will go to the Governor for consideration.

Other –

On Thursday, a number of bills that had passed both the Senate and House and had been enrolled for ratification were ratified and await consideration of the Governor. Several of these bills relate to higher education including: [S.1077](#) relating to a procurement exemption for FCC licenses authorizing use of educational broadband service spectrum granted to Greenville and Trident Technical Colleges, [H.4520](#) relating to the authority and process by which USC could issue revenue bonds to provide funds for a new business school facility and renovation of the Close-Hipp building, and [H.4680](#) relating to the make-

up of the Spartanburg Technical and Community College Area Commission. The Governor has five days to sign the bills into law, let the bills go into law without his signature, or veto the bills. If the bills are vetoed, a two-thirds vote in the Senate and House is required to override a veto.
