SUBJECT: 2020-21 Sister-State Agreements

DATE: September 15, 2020

Section 59-112-70(B) of the SC Code of Laws authorizes the Boards of Trustees of public institutions to provide fee waivers for students participating in an international Sister-State agreement program which the Governor and General Assembly have entered to promote the economic development of South Carolina. Per the statute, the Commission on Higher Education, through coordination with the State Fiscal Accountability Authority, is required to notify institutions annually of the current Sister-State agreements that provide eligible students with the non-resident fee waiver. CHE has also coordinated in recent years with the SC Department of Commerce regarding the annual affirmation of the Sister-State relationships eligible per 59-112-70(B).

Accordingly, this memorandum serves as the Commission's annual notification for academic year 2020-2021 of the continuation of the Sister-State agreements honored in prior academic years. The recognized Sister-States include:

State of Thuringen, Germany
State of Brandenburg, Germany
State of Queensland, Australia
Province of Taiwan, Republic of China
