



# History

• The Lottery Tuition Assistance Program (LTAP) was established under the S.C. Education Lottery Act in 2001 and implemented for the first-time during the 2002-03 academic year. The program was created in order to provide financial assistance to students attending an eligible two-year public or independent institution.



# Sections that pertain to <u>ALL</u> State Scholarship and Grant Programs

## **General Definitions**



"Academic year" is defined as the twelve-month period of time during which a full-time student is expected to earn thirty credit hours. The period of time used to measure the academic year consists of the fall, spring and immediately succeeding summer terms.

Independent and public institutions of higher learning in this, or any other state in the U.S., are prohibited from using State Scholarship and Grants in programs that promote financial aid incentives or packages. Any mention of State Scholarships and Grants in these financial aid packages must indicate the scholarships and grants to be separate from the University that is offering the financial aid package, and reference the State Scholarship and Grant as a <u>separate</u> financial aid award, provided to the student by the State of South Carolina.

#### Act 280 - SC Illegal Immigration Reform Act language

All eligible independent and public institutions that participate in the program must verify the lawful presence of any student who receives a State Scholarship or Grant prior to awarding to the student. The trustees of the public and independent institutions in this State shall develop and institute a process by which a State Scholarship or Grant recipient's lawful presence of in the United States is verified with the federal government pursuant to 8 USC Section 1373(c).

#### Act 280 - SC Illegal Immigration Reform Act language

"Lawful Presence" is defined as individuals who are in the United States legally and documented. Only those students whose lawful presence has been verified with the federal government prior to college enrollment will be considered to receive any State Scholarship or Grant.

### **Program Administration**

The institution is responsible for determining SC residency and lawful presence of all State **Scholarship and Grant** recipients. If it is determined that the institution has failed to verify the lawful presence and SC residency of all State **Scholarship and Grant** recipient, the institution shall immediately reimburse the funds disbursed in error.



## **Program Administration and Audits**

The Chief Executive Officer at each eligible independent and public institution shall identify to the Commission on Higher Education an institutional representative who is responsible for the operation of the Program on the campus and will serve as the contact person for the Program. The institutional representative will act as the student's fiscal agent to receive and deliver funds for use under the Program.

## **Program Administration and Audits**



A. The South Carolina Commission on Higher Education shall be responsible for the oversight of functions (e.g., guidelines, policies, rules, regulations) relative to this Program with the eligible independent and public institutions. The Commission on Higher Education shall be responsible for the allocation of funds, promulgation of guidelines and regulation governing the Program, any audits, or other oversight as may be deemed necessary to monitor the expenditure of funds.

B. According to the Audit Policies and Procedures for Scholarship and Grant Programs Manual, <u>all eligible</u> independent and public institutions must abide by all Program policies, rules and regulations. Institutions also agree to maintain and provide all pertinent information, records, reports or any information as may be required or requested by the Commission on Higher Education or the General Assembly to ensure proper administration of the Program.

## Student Records

Institutions may retain annual paper or electronic documentation for each award to include at a minimum. These are located in CHE's Audit Policies & Procedures for Scholarship and Grant Program Manual.

- Award notification;
- Enrollment status and degree-seeking status;
- Student's residency status and citizenship status;
- Affidavit/Certification documenting that the student is <u>not in default or</u> <u>does not owe a refund</u> on any state/federal financial aid;
- Affidavit/Certification documenting that the student has <u>never been</u> <u>convicted of any felonies</u> and has not been convicted of any second or subsequent alcohol/ drug related misdemeanor offense within the past academic year;
- Institutional disbursements to student;
- Military orders (if appropriate);
- Verification from Institutional Disability Services Provider of student's disability and <u>approval of reduced course-load requirement</u> (if appropriate);
- Verification of cumulative GPA and annual credit hours for renewal purposes;
- Verification from academic department of enrollment in a declared major in an eligible degree program (Enhancement purposes);
- Verification student met fourteen credit hour requirement at the end of the first year of college enrollment for the 07-08 freshman class and thereafter;

# **Military Mobilization**



Service members who are enrolled in college and are affected by military mobilizations will not be penalized for the term they are required to withdraw after the full refund period based on the institutional policies and procedures. Institutions are strongly encouraged to provide a full refund of required tuition, fees and other institutional charges or to provide a credit in a comparable amount against future charges for students who are forced to withdraw as a result of military mobilization. Additionally, the term(s) that the service member is mobilized will not count against the maximum terms of eligibility. The service member shall be allowed to receive the unused terms for their Scholarship and Scholarship Enhancement while mobilized during the succeeding summer or at the end of the maximum terms of eligibility based on initial college enrollment (provided the service member meets continued eligibility requirements).

# **FAFSA Waiver**


A college may waive the FAFSA requirement when:

- 1) the student is in high school and is participating in a dual enrollment program;
- 2) the student has already earned a bachelor's degree;
- 3) the student is enrolled in a program that is not eligible for federal funds; or


4) the dependent student is not able to obtain his/her parents', guardians' or spouse's tax form.


#### Qualify for in-state tuition and be a resident of SC

**B**. Students shall not be eligible to receive Lottery Tuition Assistance for more than one certificate, diploma, or degree earned within any five-year period unless the additional certificate, diploma, or degree constitutes progress in the same field of study

D. Students may not receive Lottery Tuition Assistance at more than one institution during the same semester.

E. Only students who are degree-seeking shall receive Lottery Tuition Assistance at their home institution. Transient students shall not receive Lottery Tuition Assistance.

#### 62-900.165.F. Student Eligibility Delay's initial college **LIFE Eligible Student** LTAP enrollment date for LIFE

1<sup>st</sup> time entering freshmen who met the requirements of **LIFE,** are enrolled in less than 12 credit hours of nonremedial and taking a minimum of six credit hours of remedial/developmental education coursework during the term

May receive LTAP for first academic year only





First-time freshmen who are eligible for the LIFE Scholarship, and enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours of non-remedial coursework

#### May not receive LTAP

Shall receive the LIFE Scholarship. Once a student is awarded the LIFE Scholarship, they are no longer eligible to receive LTAP during the same academic year.

#### 62-900.185 Institutional Disbursement of Funds

A. Actual award amounts are dependent upon the number of eligible students and the amount of funding available each academic year. Lottery Tuition Assistance may not exceed the cost of in-state tuition at the State two-year public institutions for the academic year for which the award is made at the designated institution. At independent two-year institutions, the amount cannot exceed the highest in-state tuition rate at a twoyear public institution. In calculating the amount awarded in Lottery Tuition Assistance, all federal grants and Need-based Grants must be awarded first before determining the amount eligible in Lottery Tuition Assistance to be used for payment towards cost-of-tuition.

#### What does this mean?

#### **Calculation of Need-based Aid**



Cost of Attendance <u>- EFC (expected Family Contribution – FAFSA)</u> Student's Financial Need

Awarding of Need-based Aid (Federal Pell Grant, FSEOG, Direct Subsidized Loan, Federal Work-Study, SC Need-based Grant, etc.)

#### **Calculation of PFS Eligibility**

Cost of Attendance - All Awarded Aid Student's Eligibility for PFS

#### **Determination of Non-Need-based Aid**

Cost of Attendance - All Need-based Aid Student's Eligibility for Non-need-based Aid

- Awarding of all other sources of Aid (Institutional, Federal, State (SC Tech scholarships, LTAP, LIFE), private scholarships, etc.)




#### **Calculation of SC WINS Eligibility**

Cost of Attendance - All Awarded Aid Student's Eligibility for SC WINS



\*SC WINS is last dollar to student's COA, per statute. If the student does <u>not</u> qualify for SC WINS, you would award PFS last to COA, per regulation.

#### 62-900.175 Duration of Award and Continued Eligibility (B-C)



59.150.360. Tuition assistance to attend state technical college or public two-year institution; eligibility; county funding for technical colleges

F. In order for a student to be eligible after attempting twenty-four academic credit hours the student must have earned a grade point average of <u>2.0 or better on a 4.0 grading scale</u>



# 62-900.180. Students with Disabilities

A. Students that are registered with the Office of Disability/Accessibility services may receive LTAP if <u>approved</u> for a reduced course load of less than six credit hours.
